

NIH - Neuromodulation/Neurostimulation Device Development for Mental Health Applications (R01 & R21)

# Descrição

The National Institutes of Health (NIH) (https://www.nih.gov/), a part of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, is the primary Federal agency for conducting and supporting medical research. Composed of 27 Institutes and Centers (http://www.nih.gov/icd/), the NIH provides leadership and financial support to researchers in every state and throughout the world.

The purpose of this notice of funding opportunity (NOFO) (https://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/pa-files/PAR-25-287.html) is to encourage applications seeking to develop the next generation of brain stimulation devices for treating mental health disorders. Applications are encouraged that will either 1) develop novel brain stimulation devices or 2) significantly enhance, by means of hardware/software improvements, the effectiveness of brain stimulation devices that are currently U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA)-approved or cleared. Applications to this NOFO are not expected to be hypothesis-driven, but should propose design-directed, developmental, or discovery-driven technology research using integrative approaches. Although the application should focus on the engineering development and bench top testing of the tool, animal and limited, non-clinical trial human testing necessary to demonstrate initial proof of concept is allowable. This NOFO uses the R01 grant mechanism, encouraging longer term projects, whereas the companion NOFO (https://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/pa-files/PAR-25-286.html), PAR-25-286 seeks grant applications encouraging shorter duration, high-risk studies.

# Elegibilidade

Non-domestic (non-U.S.) Entities (Foreign Institutions) are eligible to apply. Foreign (non-US) institutions must follow policies described in the NIH Grants Policy Statement (http://grants.nih.gov/grants/policy/nihgps/HTML5/section\_1/1.2\_definition\_of\_terms.htm), and procedures for foreign institutions described throughout the Application Guide.

Any individual(s) with the skills, knowledge, and resources necessary to carry out the proposed research as the Program Director/Principal Investigator (PD/PI) is invited to work with his/her organization to develop an application for support. Individuals from underrepresented racial and ethnic groups as well as individuals with disabilities are always encouraged to apply for NIH support.

Applicants must have a valid Dun and Bradstreet Universal Numbering System (DUNS) (http://fedgov.dnb.com/webform) number in order to begin each of the following registrations: Central Contractor Registration (CCR) (http://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/url\_redirect.htm?id=11124), Grants.gov (http://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/url\_redirect.htm?id=11122) and eRA Commons (http://grants.nih.gov/grants/guide/url\_redirect.htm?id=11121).

## Valor Financiado

R01: Application budgets are not limited but need to reflect the actual needs of the proposed project.

R21: The combined budget for direct costs for the two-year project period may not exceed \$275,000. No more than \$200,000 may be requested in any single year.

# Forma de Solicitação

There are several options available to submit the application through Grants.gov to NIH and Department of Health and Human Services partners. Candidates must use one of the submission options to access the application forms for the opportunity:

TARGET=https%3A%2F%2Fpublic.era.nih.gov%2Fcommons%2FcommonsInit.do) to track the application. Applicants should check with their institutional officials regarding availability;
- 3. Use Grants.gov (http://www.grants.gov/web/grants/applicants/download-application-package.html#search=true&oppNum=PAR-19-387) Workspace to prepare and submit the application and eRA Commons (http://public.era.nih.gov/commons/) to track the application.
